DESCRIPTION OF THE COMMISSION

The Humans Rights Council has been advocated by the Landsraad to deliberate upon grave accusations of treachery, exploitation, and the violation of the Imperial Charter of Sentient Peoples on the desert world of *Arrakis*. This commission has been granted the authority to issue non-binding solutions, propose diplomatic mediations, and commend sanctions to the Landsraad and the Emperor's court. Its aim is to examine the political and ethical tensions surrounding the planet *Arrakis*, where Emperor Shaddam IV has been accused of conspiring with *House Harkonnen* against *House Atreides*. As a result, the native *Fremen* population is being subjected to the violation of their rights. Delegates are invited to assess the legitimacy of *spice* exploitation and the resolution of the debate on whether the resource should be administered by the native indigenous Fremen or by external powers that have violently occupied the planet. Finally, the topic encourages reflection on sovereignty, resource extraction and human rights.





PROCEDURE

1. Delegates will need to deliver an opening speech to introduce themselves in the role they are representing within the commission. They must also submit a position paper outlining their proposed solutions and stance on the central conflicts of the meeting.
2. By using first person language, as they will be portraying characters, delegates will present their opinions and debate based on their role's objectives and the side they represent on the commission. Procedural matters will be guided by roll call, formal opening, and voting on motions led by the commission board. These are all detailed in the Handbook.
3. The commission will alternate among different types of debate: extraordinary, formal, informal, and others. During these sessions, delegates will present their ideas and opinions. The ultimate goal is to reach a common agreement that addresses the objectives set for the meeting.
4. Finally, an additional conflict will be solved and presented as a press release, alongside the working paper drafted and approved by all members of the commission.

TOPIC

The alleged conspiracy between Emperor Shaddam IV and House Harkonnen to annihilate the House Atreides; a political maneuver that triggered the collapse of Atreides leadership on Arrakis and ignited widespread unrest. This conflict catalyzed demands for the recognition of the Fremen rights over their native planet, Arrakis. The principal matter concerns the legitimacy of spice exploitation and whether control should reside with the Fremen or with the Imperial forces and the economic elites represented by House Harkonnen.

APPROACH

The participants of the negotiation will debate themes like the non-recognized rights of the Fremen over their native planet. In addition, bringing justice to the fallen Atreides House, and establishing a proper regent to control the spice will be key objectives to address. Another goal is to maintain space commerce, ensuring that each delegation secures its rightful claims and responsibilities, while keeping in mind that power and universal order are ruled by *spice*.





OBJECTIVE

The objective is to reach an agreement on the future of the planet Arrakis, including the recognition of the Fremen sovereignty, the legitimacy of spice exploitation, and the political consequences of the imperial conspiracy. The final resolution of this commission should reflect the delegates' worries of committing to justice, sustainability, and the protection of human rights.

HISTORICAL CONTEXT

The Betrayal of House Atreides

Planet Arrakis becomes the epicenter of war over the spice (a substance vital for interstellar navigation, longevity, economic power and prophecy) after Emperor Shaddam IV conspires with House Harkonnen to eliminate House Atreides.

The Emperor offers Duke Leto Atreides stewardship of Arrakis, only to orchestrate a brutal ambush that *decimates* the Atreides forces. Paul Atreides and his mother, Lady Jessica, survive the attack and flee into the desert (Fandom, n.d.).

The Fremen Rebellion

Jessica is accepted by the Fremen - the desert's native population - and undergoes a ritual to become their Reverend Mother. This ritual is deeply rooted in Zensunni theology and Bene Gesserit spiritual engineering. It blends Fremen mysticism with the Sisterhood's long-term genetic and religious manipulation.

Guided by prophetic visions and Fremen belief, Paul declares himself the messianic *Lisan al-Gaib*. He leads a rebellion against the Harkonnens and the Emperor. His rise is both political and theological, fulfilling the Bene Gesserit's Missionaria Protectiva (a program that seeded religious myths across the galaxy to prepare populations for manipulation).

Paul's ascent culminates in a decisive battle that topples imperial control, marking a turning point in the political and spiritual history of Arrakis (Fandom, n.d.).

Paul's Rise to Power

After becoming sacred leader of the *Fremen*, Paul Atreides challenges Emperor Shaddam IV Corino for control over Arrakis. The Emperor stands accused of conspiring with House Harkonnen to destroy House Atreides and seize the planet.





At the heart of this conflict lies the *spice melange*. Control over the spice determines universal power, making its exploitation a matter of imperial dominance, Fremen sovereignty, and human rights.

The Final Confrontation

The theological dimensions of this struggle are profound. The Fremen see Paul as the fulfillment of Zensunni prophecies, while the Bene Gesserit view him as a disruption to their centuries-long breeding program.

Paul's final confrontation centers on the future of Arrakis, the legitimacy of Fremen claims, and the fate of the imperial order. He defeats the Emperor's forces, kills Feyd-Rautha in ritual combat, and forces Shaddam to surrender.

Though Paul secures political control by marrying Princess Irulan (a Bene Gesserit acolyte strategically placed to preserve the Sisterhood's influence), his decision to launch a war against the Great Houses fractures his bond with Chani and marks the beginning of a violent new era (Fandom, n.d.).

CURRENT SITUATION

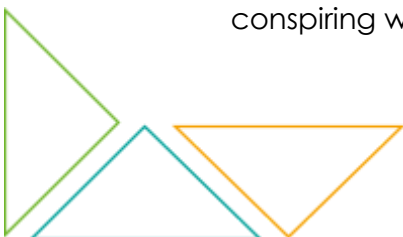
After rising as the spiritual leader of the Fremen, Paul Atreides confronts Emperor Shaddam IV Corrino to claim control of the planet Arrakis. The Emperor faces accusations of colluding with House Harkonnen to destroy House Atreides and provoke war over the planet.

At the center of this conflict is the spice melange. This rare substance is vital for space navigation, economic dominance, and prophetic power. Moreover, whoever controls the spice holds power over the universe. As a result, the exploitation of Arrakis becomes not only a strategic imperial concern but a profound human rights issue.

Paul's confrontation marks a decisive moment. It reshapes the future of Arrakis, questions the sovereignty of the Fremen, and threatens the legitimacy of the imperial regime.

GUIDING QUESTIONS

1. What evidence supports the accusations of Emperor Shaddam IV conspiring with House Harkonnen against House Atreides?





2. How are the Fremen being affected (socially, culturally, environmentally) by imperial abuse?
3. How should the control of the *spice* be managed? Should it be considered a sovereign right for the Fremen?
4. In what form can the violated rights of the Fremen be repaired by justice?
5. Which mechanisms could be established to guarantee that imperial abuses against the Fremen are not repeated?
6. Should there be any sanctions imposed on House Harkonnen and the Emperor? If so, how should justice be administered to address the violations of the Fremen's rights?
7. How can the interplanetary community support Fremen's claims?
8. What responsibility do Great Houses and other planets share, regarding the abuses committed on Arrakis, considering their interest in the spice and their silence in response to the exploitation of the Fremen people?
9. How can justice for the Fremen and accountability for imperial abuses be pursued without destabilizing the political order of the universe, especially given the central role of the spice in maintaining interplanetary governance?

DELEGATIONS

IN FAVOR OF FREMEN

- **Paul Atreides (Muad'Dib) - In favor of Fremen/Anti-Imperial:** Central figure in Dune, born in planet Caladan and in nobility, but destined to become a messianic leader. Throughout his life, he is trained in combat and strategy around Bene Gesserit disciplines. He later survives the betrayal on Arrakis, joins the indigenous Fremen community and awakens powerful prophetic abilities. Followed by his entrance to the Fremen, Muad'Dib leads the Fremen in the fight against the Harkonnen and the emperor (Fandom, s.f.).
- **Gurney Halleck - In favor of Fremen/Against Harkonnen:** Loyal Warmaster, skilled fighter and musician from House Atreides, who trains Paul Atreides in combat while quoting the Orange Catholic Bible. He disappeared and surfaced as a hardened spice muggler, after surviving the Harkonnen-led ambush on Arrakis and joined Paul's rebellion after encountering him again in a Fremen ambush against Harkonnen. (Fandom, n.d.).



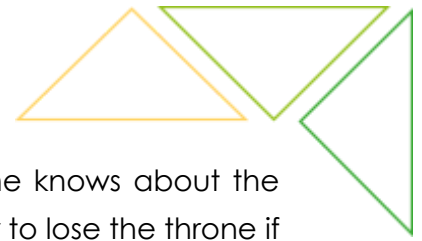


- **Stilgar - In favor of Fremen:** Extreme religious Fremen that fought against the Harkonnen, with a strong relationship with the Atrides he observed the ascendent power of Paul that made him start proclaiming Paul as the Lisan Al Gaib between the Fremen (Fandom, n.d.).
- **Chani Kynes - In favor of Fremen/Anti-Imperial:** Woman, first introduced as a fierce Fremen warrior and daughter of the paleontologist Liet-Kynes. She first encounters Paul Atrides in the deep desert after his escape from the Harkonnen attack; being initially withdrawn to meet him. As Paul integrates into the Fremen, Chani becomes his most loyal ally and guide, Chani then fights along with Paul in the Fremen uprising against House Harkonnen and the Emperor, helping him balance his leadership, after Paul becomes Muad'Dib and there's a religious fever around him, she remains loyal to him, but still begins to question the cost of this growing power (Fandom, n.d.).
- **Harah - In favor of Fremen:** Widow of the deceased Jamis and the nurse of the Atrides present in Arrakis. Harah becomes part of Paul Atride's household after the death of her husband in a Fremen duel. Even though Paul chooses not to take her as a wife, she remains loyal, helps raise Alia and supports Chani during key moments of Paul's rise among the Fremen (Fandom, n.d.).
- **Liet-Kynes - In favor of Fremen/Mediator:** Fremen ecologist and Imperial Paleontologist who secretly works to fulfill his father's dream of transforming Arrakis into a lush world. Liet helped House Atrides and finally sacrifices himself to protect Paul and Jessica during the Harkonnen betrayal. His death in the desert marks a turning point, strengthening the Fremen's resolve and supporting Paul's rise to leadership (Fandom, n.d.).

PRO-IMPERIAL

- **Emperor Shaddam IV Corrino - Pro-Imperial/Against Fremen:** Padishah Emperor of the Known Universe, a powerful and politically cautious ruler. He is later accused of having orchestrated the downfall of House Atrides by supporting House Harkonnen's ambush on Arrakis. Then, after arriving on the planet, his plan of confronting the growing threat of Paul and the Fremen rebellion, begins (Fandom, n.d.).
- **Princess Irulan Corrino - Pro-Imperial/Against Fremen:** Emperor's daughter and an apprentice of the Reverend Mother Gaius Helen Mohiam, because





of her training and the plotting of the Bene Gesserit she knows about the betrayal against house Atreides and the risk of his father to lose the throne if the truth is revealed to the great houses, making her oppose the victory of the Fremen over Arrakis. She's important mostly for her role of princess for the Bene Gesserit, and a strategic marriage between Paul and Lady Jessica. (Fandom, n.d.).

- **Sardaukar Bashar (Sardaukar Colonel) - Pro-Imperial/Against Fremen:** Principal leader of the Sardaukar troops at the service of the emperor Padishah. He has a part in the imperial forces and in the assault on House Atreides (Fandom, n.d.).
- **Herald of change - Imperial Messenger:** Representative of the emperor and the House Corrino responsible for communicating to the Atreides the offer from the emperor to give them control over Arrakis at the start of the imperial plan. He arrives on Caladan accompanied by members of the Imperial Court, the Spacing Guild and Bene Gesserit sister to formally deliver the imperial proclamation. During the ceremony, he reads the Emperor's statement aloud to Duke Leto, confirms the acceptance of terms, and oversees the sealing of the agreement; this event marks the official transfer of stewardship before the events that lead to the betrayal in Arrakis (Fandom, n.d.).
- **Scytale (Ileilaxu master) - Pro-Imperial/Against Paul:** Face dancer who is part of the conspiracy against the Muad'Dib empire in the future, and very loyal to the House Corrino. He plays a prominent role in major historical events that spanned more than five thousand years (Fandom, n.d.).

IN FAVOR OF HARKONNEN / AGAINST FREMEN

- **Baron Vladimir Harkonnen - Against Fremen/Pro-Imperial:** Primary conspirator behind the plotting against the Atreides, where the emperor gifted Arrakis to the Atreides house so they could kill all their members in covering it as an accident in the planet, returning the power to the house Harkonnen over the planet; he plots against the emperor after discovering that Paul Atreides survived and the truth of his betrayal is coming to light. He grants Arrakis to his nephew Feyd Rautha Harkonnen, so he gets the





throne after the emperor loses it, retiring the power from Rabban over the planet and maintaining the power of the Harkonnen (Fandom, n.d.).

- Glossu Rabban (Beast Rabban) - Against Fremen:** Brutal enforcer of House Harkonnen, who has the task of governing Arrakis after the fall of House Atreides. The beast, nephew of Baron Vladimir Harkonnen, follows the Rabban rules through fear and violence. Apart from that, he oppresses the Fremen and oversees spice production with ruthless efficiency. Rabban is strategically later replaced by Feyd-Rautha, which fuels the Fremen-led rebellion under Muad'Dib (Fandom, n.d.).
- Feyd Rautha - Against Fremen/In favor of Harkonnen:** Part of the reproduction project of the Bene Gesserit in which Feyd was going to create the Kwisatz Haderach by reproducing with the daughter of Jessica Atreides. However, instead of bearing a daughter, Jessica gave birth to Paul Atreides, which formed a high tension between Paul Atreides and Feyd Rautha because of them being the heir of opposite houses. On his eighteenth birthday celebration, the Baron Vladimir Harkonnen gift him the control over Arrakis, in which Feyd started fighting the oppression of the Fremen lead by Muah Dib while being the next emperor after Shaddam IV loses the throne in the Harkonnens plans. (Fandom, n.d.).
- Piter De Vries - In favor of Harkonnen/Against Atreides:** Ambitious and sadistic Mentat at the service of Vladimir Harkonnen, and key assassin implied in the plotting against the Atreides. He is also an important element in the plan of the Harkonnen against House Atreides and in orchestrating the downfall of Duke Leto by the manipulation of Dr. Yueh, central to the plans of installing a Harkonnen tyrant and presenting Feyd-Rautha as a savior (Fandom, n.d.).
- Harkonnen Commander (actual character) - In favor of Harkonnen:** Serves under Feyd-Rautha during the assault of Sietch Tabr. Finally, Feyd-Rautha kills him on the spot, showcasing the brutal and unforgiving nature of the Harkonnen; the reason for this was his suggestion on staying aboard their ship instead of joining the ground attack (Fandom, n.d.).
- Duncan Idaho – Pro - Fremen / Pro-Atreides / Contra - Harkonnen:** Loyal swordmaster of House Atreides, serving Duke Leto and later Paul Atreides. He earns the trust of the Fremen and becomes a bridge between both peoples. During the Harkonnen assault on Arrakis, Duncan sacrifices himself





defending the Atreides, symbolizing loyalty and courage against Harkonnen cruelty (Fandom, n.d.).

MEDIATORS - MIXED INTERESTS

- **Lady Jessica - In favor of Fremen/Mediator:** Bound concubine of Duke Leto Atreides and mother of Paul Atreides. A powerful Bene Gesserit who defies her order by bearing Paul. Followed by the betrayal of House Atreides and Duke Leto's death, she escapes into the desert with her son, where they are taken in by the Fremen. As a way of securing her surroundings, Jessica undergoes the Water of Life Ritual. As a result, she becomes a Reverend Mother for the Fremen and awakes ancestral memories of her and Alia, her unborn daughter, she supports Paul into embracing his destiny as Muad'Dib and leading the Fremen (Fandom, n.d.).
- **Liet-Kynes - In favor of Fremen/Mediator:** Fremen ecologist and Imperial Paleontologist who secretly works to fulfill his father's dream of transforming Arrakis into a lush world. Liet helped House Atreides and finally sacrifices himself to protect Paul and Jessica during the Harkonnen betrayal. His death in the desert marks a turning point, making the Fremen more determined to help Paul become their leader (Fandom, n.d.).

BENE GESSERIT

- **Lady Margot Fenring - Bene Gesserit Interests:** Bene Gesserit operative who is deeply embedded in the political intrigue. Margot, by using her skills in observation, manipulation and Bene Gesserit conditioning, includes Feyd-Rautha Harkonnen as a candidate for being the Kwisatz Haderach, part of the sisterhood breeding program to preserve the Harkonnen bloodline. Finally, Paul Atreides disrupts the plans by becoming the Kwisatz Haderach outside their control (Fandom, n.d.).
- **Reverend Mother Gaius Helen Mohiam - In favor of Bene Gesserit/Against Paul:** She first tests Paul Atreides with the gom jabbar to assess he is truly a human, which reveals the Bene Gesserit's interest in his genetic potential. After that, she becomes a key political figure, as she accompanies the Emperor to Arrakis and participates in the confrontation with Paul, while in secret she plots to replace the emperor after the conflict in Arrakis knowing she has previously manipulated candidate Feyd Rautha (Fandom, n.d.).





PRO-ATREIDES / AGAINST HARKONNEN

- **Thufir Hawat - In favor of Atreides/Against Harkonnen:** Mentat responsible for the security and master of assassins from the Atreides house for three generations that survived the Atreides house massacre and worked for the Harkonnen, plotting his vengeance against them for killing his duke Leto Atreides (Fandom, n.d.).

AGAINST PAUL / PRO-NOBILITY

- **Memnon Thorvald - Against Fremen/In favor of Landsraad Nobility/Against Paul:** Memnon, Earl of House from the planet Ipyr, noble member of the Landsraad, plays a pivotal role in opposing Emperor Paul Atreides during the early years of his reign. After the fall of the Corrino Empire, Memnon leads a rebellion of noble houses against Paul, beginning with a dramatic walkout during the Emperor's speech to the Landsraad. He organizes resistance efforts, including the defense of Galicia and an attempted assassination plot. Apart from that, his actions mark him as a key figure in the political unrest that follows Paul's ascension, setting the stage for deeper conflict between the imperial authority and noble resistance (Fandom, n.d.).

GLOSSARY

- **Accountability:** the fact of being responsible for what you do and able to give a satisfactory reason for it, or the degree to which this happens (Cambridge University, n.d.).
- **Arrakis:** planet where the spice is produced and exploited
- **Bene Gesserit:** witches able to manage and invoke the voice that controls politics in the shadows
- **Fedaikin:** fremen warriors
- **Fremen:** originary inhabitants from the Arrakis deserts
- **Harkonnen:** universal house that controls Arrakis actually with the help of the emperor
- **House Atreides:** noble house treasured by the emperor
- **House Corrino:** noble house that ascended to rule the universe
- **House Harkonnen:** noble house that controls Arrakis allied with the emperor
- **Justice:** fairness in the way people are dealt with (Cambridge University, n.d.).





- **Kwisatz Haderach:** prophetic male Bene Gesserit with access to all memories of its kind
- **Legitimacy:** the quality of being legal (Cambridge University, n.d.).
- **Lisan Al Gaib:** prophesied messiah from the Fremen and its leader (Paul Atreides)
- **Mentat:** discipline used by the great houses that replaced the banned thinking machines, by increasing the thinking process and memory of the subject.
- **Navigators:** humans mutated by the spice that know all the paths in the universe
- **Reparation:** payment for harm or damage (Cambridge University, n.d.).
- **Reverend Mother:** female religious leader in a culture
- **Sardaukar:** the elite army of the universe emperor
- **Self-determination:** the ability or power to make decisions for yourself, especially the power of a nation to decide how it will be governed (Cambridge University, n.d.).
- **Shai Hulud:** giant worm that inhabits Arrakis
- **Spice:** addictive substance that allows the space travel
- **Stability:** a situation in which something is not likely to move or change (Cambridge University, n.d.).
- **Stillsuit:** suit that filtrates corporal water in the desert
- **Sovereignty:** the power of a country to control its own government (Cambridge University, n.d.).
- **The voice:** the power that allows the user to control others' will

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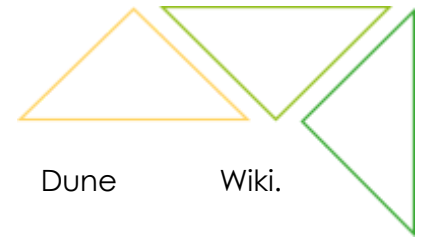
